1. What Would I Do?

Landscaping & Grounds Maintenance Labourers assist in the

construction of landscapes and related structures. You maintain lawns, gardens, athletic fields, golf courses, cemeteries, parks, landscaped interiors and other landscaped areas.

Your duties may include:

 spread top soil; lay sod; plant flowers, grass, shrubs and trees; and perform other duties to help with the construction of a landscape and related structures

- cut, rake, fertilize and water lawns; weed gardens; prune shrubs and trees; and perform other maintenance duties as directed by supervisor
- maintain lawns and grass along roadsides
- operate and maintain power mowers, tractors, snowblowers, chain saws, electric clippers, sod cutters, pruning saws and other landscape maintenance equipment
- spray and dust trees, shrubs, lawns and gardens, as directed, to control insects and disease

2. Am I Suited For This Job?

Landscaping & Grounds Maintenance Labourers should have:

- physical strength
- interest in plants
- good design sense
- good spatial perception

You should be:

- physically fit
- able to work outdoors in all types of weather
- detail oriented

Landscaping & grounds maintenance labourers work outdoors in various weather conditions. The work is physically demanding and can be hard on the back. You may use dangerous chemicals, such as pesticides and fertilizers.

3. What Are The Wages And Benefits?

In British Columbia, the median annual salary for *Landscaping & grounds maintenance labourers* is \$41,712. Hourly wages can range from \$15.20 - \$32.31.


Gardeners who work for themselves have the potential to earn the most money but are more financially vulnerable when work is scarce. If you work for landscape contractors and other large companies, you have better job security but typically receive lower salaries. In most climates, gardening is seasonal; many gardeners are laid off during the winter months

4. What Is The Job Outlook In BC?

17,900 people are currently employed as Landscaping and Grounds Maintenance Labourers in BC. It is anticipated there will be 5,570 new jobs between 2019 and 2029.

Most jobs are located in the Mainland/Southwest, Vancouver Island/Coast and Thomson Okanagan regions of BC.

5. How do I become a Landscaping & Grounds

Maintenance Labourer?

In BC, there is no certification required to work as a Landscaping & Grounds Maintenance Labourer. Some secondary education is required and high school graduation may be preferred by some employers.

Employers *may* require that you hold a *Landscape [Pesticide] Applicator Certificate*.

Click on "Start Search" beside Canadian Businesses, then select the "Advanced Search" button. Select both "Keyword/SIC/NAICS" under Business Type and "City" under Geography. In the top search box enter "gardeners"** and click SEARCH. Select the appropriate headings. Lower down, select the Province, choose the cities, and click the "View Results" button. ******You can also try searching on "landscape" or "grounds".

If you are using a computer from outside the Library, you will need a Vancouver Public Library card to login to this database. After clicking on the database name, you will be asked to enter your library card number and PIN (usually last four digits of your telephone number).

Networking, Volunteering and Temporary Agencies

Many positions are filled by people who have been recommended by someone they know. Networking, working as a volunteer or registering with a temporary employment agency are good ways of helping you find jobs and meet people in your industry.

Networking and the Hidden Job Market:

When looking for work, be sure to talk to friends, relatives and neighbours. They may know someone who is hiring! Working as a volunteer, attending events, and joining clubs and associations are good ways to gain "Canadian experience." They are also good ways to meet people to learn about the local job market.
