#### **SUMMARY**

This report provides the 2022 Board Self Evaluation Survey for planning in 2023. The survey was last reviewed in the fall of 2022.

#### **RECOMMENDATION**

#### **INDIGENOUS CONSIDERATIONS**

Truth and Reconciliation is a strategic priority for VPL that is considered across library policy and operations, and is incorporated in the 2020-2023 Strategic Plan. In November 2022, the VPL Board approved the Indigenous Rights and Reconciliation Strategy. Training is offered to ensure that trustees are prepared for discussions that support these strategies, and within the self-evaluation, trustees are asked whether the Board considers the impacts of its decisions on Indigenous peoples, encourages staff to consult with local Indigenous communities, and is committed to advancing Truth and Reconciliation.

#### **BACKGROUND**

The Board self-evaluation survey is designed to evaluate how well the Board understands its responsibilities individually and as a group and to identify areas for training and development. The Board Chair and Executive Assistant work together to produce and distribute the web-based

survey in early November each year, and results are discussed at a subsequent meeting. Trustees modified the report in 2020 to clarify and to reduce the number of questions.

#### **DISCUSSION**

The Governance Committee discussed the 2022 self-evaluation results at its June 2023 meeting as part of the discussion of training and development needs for the Board.

The Committee needs to consider whether any revisions are needed to the survey for 2023, and appoint 1-2 trustees to review the content if necessary and lead the process.
