# **SUMMARY**

This report is to seek Board approval of Vancouver Public Library's 2020 Strategic Plan Outline.

## PURPOSE

# RECOMMENDATION

That the Board approve the VPL 2020 Strategic Plan Outline.

## COMMITTEE DISCUSSION

Trustee Epstein recommended that the Mayor be approached for a message for inclusion in the Plan. The CRPD Committee recommended that the Board approve the outline.

## BACKGROUND

The project to develop the Vancouver Public Library 2017-2019 Strategic Plan (referred to commonly as: 'VPL 2020' kicked off in February, 2016. The project is co-led by the Director of Planning & Projects and an external consultancy (Prime Strategic Planning). The project team includes four managers from across the organization, and an analyst.

Research and analysis to support the plan began in March. The research program includes a current state analysis (internal and external environment analyses and competitive landscape scan), trend research (to support the definition of the future state vision) and a gap analysis (to support the development of a Strategic Framework). Research and analysis continues through August with two interim deliverables coming to the Board for information: A Strategic Assessment (to be received in June) and a Gap Analysis (to be received in July).

Consultation on the strategic plan kicked-off on April 15<sup>th</sup> and ran until May 13<sup>th</sup>. The first wave of consultation included: Board and Management Retreats; 30 in-person sessions; a survey; and targeted engagement sessions with groups of strategic interest (Newcomers to Canada, Homeless, Aboriginals, and Teens). Over 2,000 people were reached in the first wave of engagement. Two more waves of engagement are planned – the next in June and the final in August through September.

The Strategic Outline attached in Appendix A for approval illustrates the elements intended for inclusion in the final Strategic Plan. Approval of the Outline by the Board at this stage ensures that the ongoing research, analysis, and engagement is focused appropriately and that it directly supports the development of the required elements of the Plan.

The outline as proposed ensures that the Plan includes the elements necessary to define a compelling, comprehensive, and evidence-based roadmap to guide the organization's work to 2020.
